### Debussy: Clair de Lune

Clair de Lune translates to moonlight. You will probably notice that it has a similar feeling to the Chopin Nocturne we listen to.

#### Things to listen for:

- The subtle pushes and pulls of tempo
- The frequent subtle changes in dynamics
- How many notes in a row does he play at exactly the same dynamic or tempo? (How often does he change the fast/slow and loud/quiet?)
- What time of day do you think would be best for listening to this?
- What personal mood do you think would be best for you to be in to enjoy this song?
  - o Do you think this song could help you change your mood?



- How do the different performances change the feeling of the music (from each other)?
- Which one do you prefer? Why
