To review, the order of **flats** in a key signature is:

Battle Ends And Down Goes Charles Father

The **flats** always appear like this on the **grand staff** 



In the last lesson we looked at how to figure out the key of a piece of music from the **key signature**. In this lesson we'll look at how to figure out the number of flats in a given **key**.

The method is: Take one **flat** past the name of the **key**.

For example: E major

Battle Ends And Down Goes Charles Father

Eb major has 3 flats - Bb, Eb, and Ab

Remember: F major has only B

Here's some examples to practice.

Remember the flats always appear like this:
